

Dragonflies Curriculum Newsletter

On the Farm and Minibeasts

Summer Term 1 2023

Mathematics

The children will consolidate their understanding of numbers 1-10 and number bonds to 10. They will identify numbers to 20 and using a rang of resources they will begin to build each number, recognising that the numbers 1-9 repeat after every full 10 e.g 12, 13, 14, 15. The children will consolidate counting on and back to 20 and beyond. They will be encouraged to notice similarities and differences as they match and sort objects in different contexts. They will have regular opportunities to compare and order quantities and measure, focusing on more and fewer.

Literacy

The children will continue to use their knowledge from phonics to write words using the sounds they know. Some of the children will begin forming simple sentences, focusing on capital letters fingers spaces and full stops.

In handwriting sessions the formation of both lower and upper case letters will continue to be practised.

Phonics will continue to be taught daily and this term the children will begin working on Phase 4, which is the final phase of the Reception Little Wandle phonics programme in preparation for starting Year 1 in September.

Dragonflies will continue to have group reading sessions and will bring home a reading book from these sessions.

Phonics books – Changed every Thursday Library books - Changed every Friday Rainbow Reads are counted on Thursday Please make sure your child's reading books and diaries are in school every day.

Tapestry

A home learning task will be added to Tapestry each Friday, this is to be completed by the following Friday. Please add photographs/videos of your child's learning at home.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development We will continue to learn about the Anker Valley Virtues. The children will further develop an understanding of their feelings and those of others. They will begin to think about changes they have experienced in preparation for their transition to Year 1.



Communication & Language

We will read stories about minibeasts and farm animals, such as The Very Hungry Caterpillar, What the Ladybird Heard, Superworm, The Scarecrow's Secret and Farmer Duck. The children will offer explanations as to why things might happen making use of recently introduced vocabulary. They will express their ideas and feelings about experiences using full sentences, a range of tenses and conjunctions. 100

Expressive Arts & Design

The children will continue to explore a variety of tools, materials and techniques to create pictures and models of the characters within the stories we read, including the Very Hungry Caterpillar, What the Ladybird Heard, Superworm and Farmer Duck. They will continue to develop their own narrative through role playing different characters both in the role play area and with the small world resources.

Understanding the World

We will explore the animals in our surrounding natural environment. We will discuss how we care for the natural world around us. We will learn about lifecycles of different animals, including the life cycle of a butterfly and will have a special delivery of caterpillars to help us with our learning.

Our Forest School Sessions will take place on a *Thursday* during this half term. The children will need their wellies and puddle suits in school.
